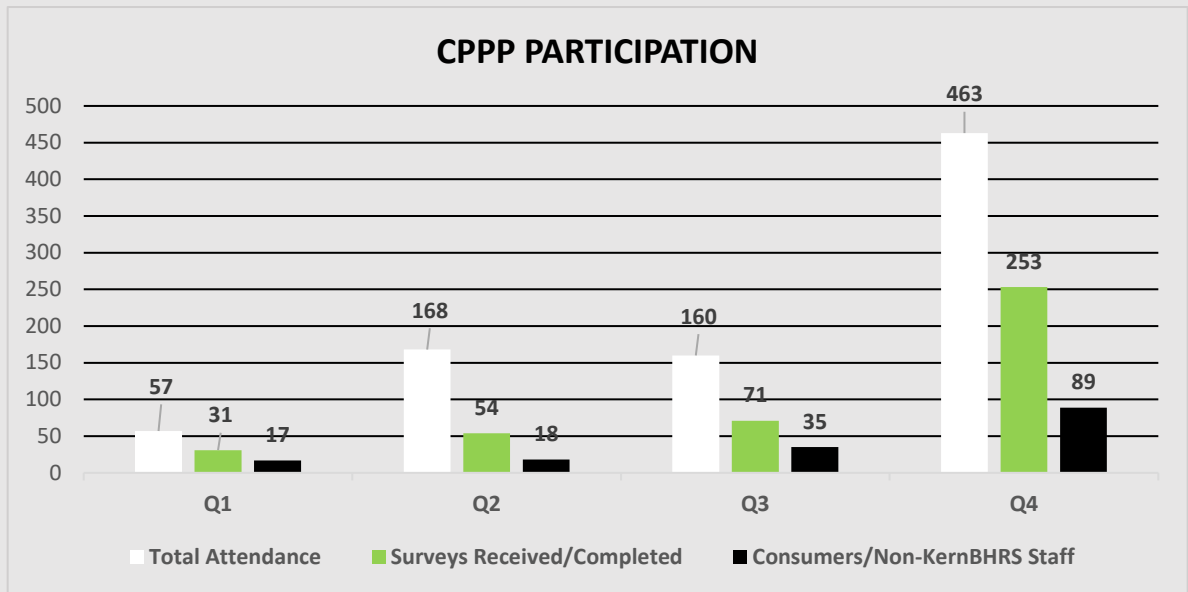




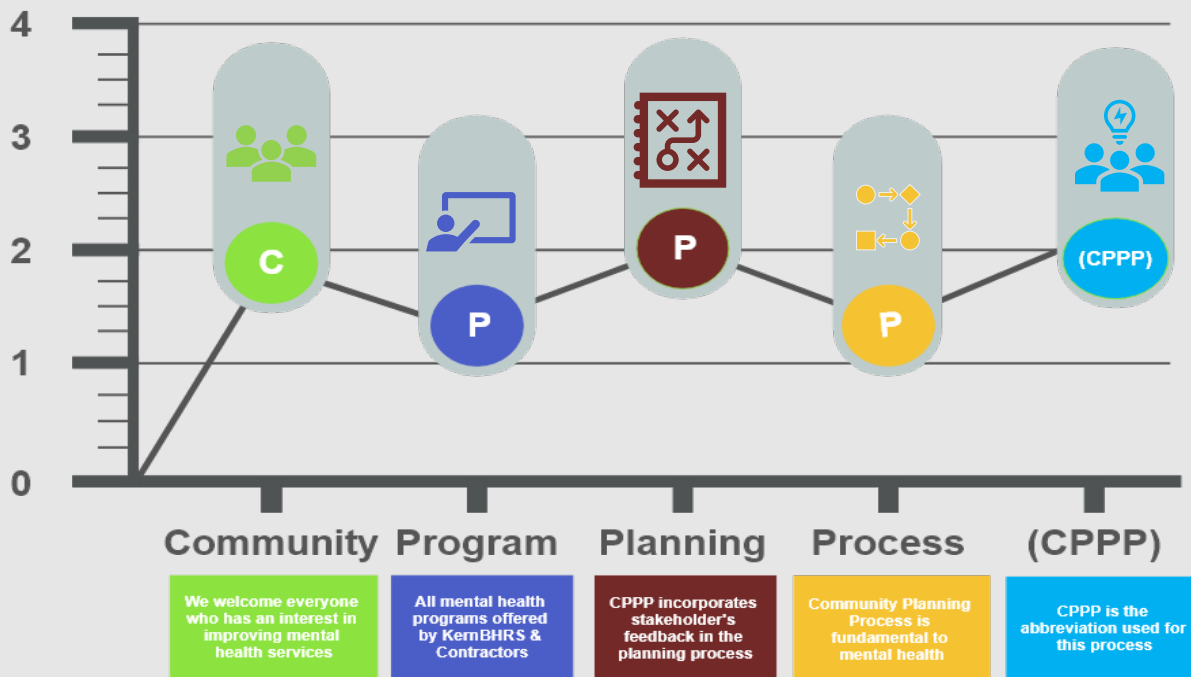
# CPPP Quarterly Report: Q4 (April - June)

## FY 2021 - 2022



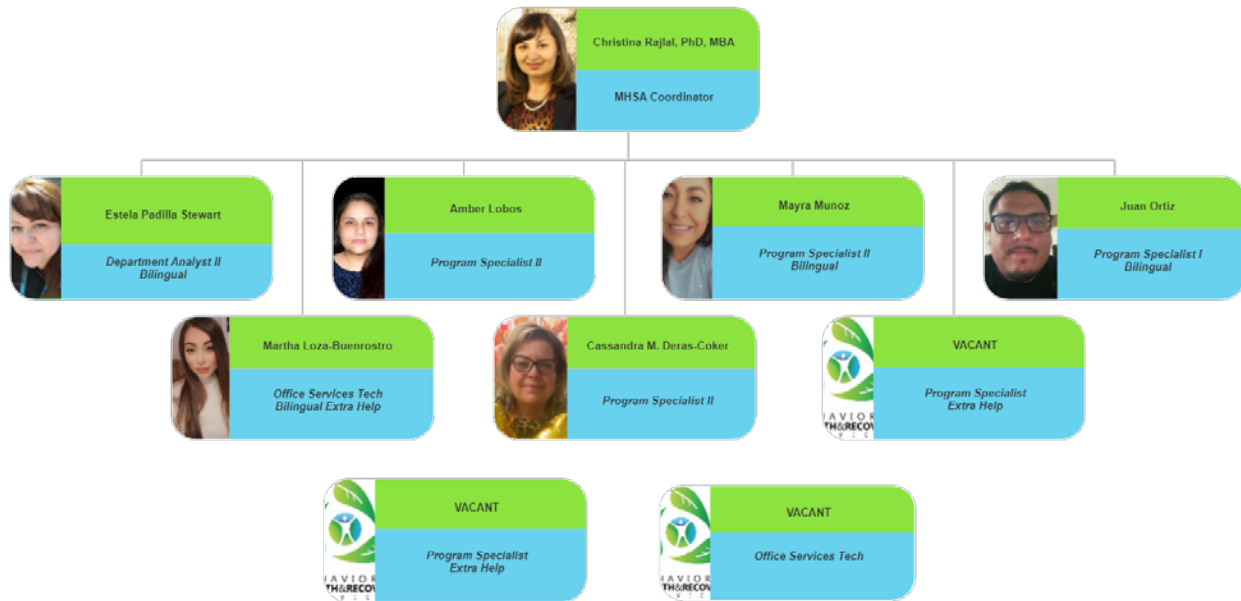
## MHSA & CPPP Mental Health Services Act

Stakeholder feedback advances the principles of Mental Health Services Act and the use of effective practices to assure the transformation of the mental health system in Kern County.



During the 4th Quarter of FY 2021/2022, Kern County continued to stay under the state ordered quarantine due to the Covid-19 pandemic. This is the 9th Quarter our county and state have operated under Covid-19 restrictions.

As reported in the previous three quarterly reports, Kern Behavioral Health & Recovery Services (KernBHRS) and the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) continues to experience changes in personnel. As of the end of June 2022, our team has three vacant positions that plans to fulfill in the upcoming FY 2022/2023.



We will continue to work with KernBHRS Human Resources team to find qualified candidates to fill vacancies.

**CPPP Participation**

During this quarter, we provided MHSA education to **463** stakeholders. However, not everyone responded to our request to provide feedback using our Demographic surveys; we were able to collect data from a total of **253** participants.

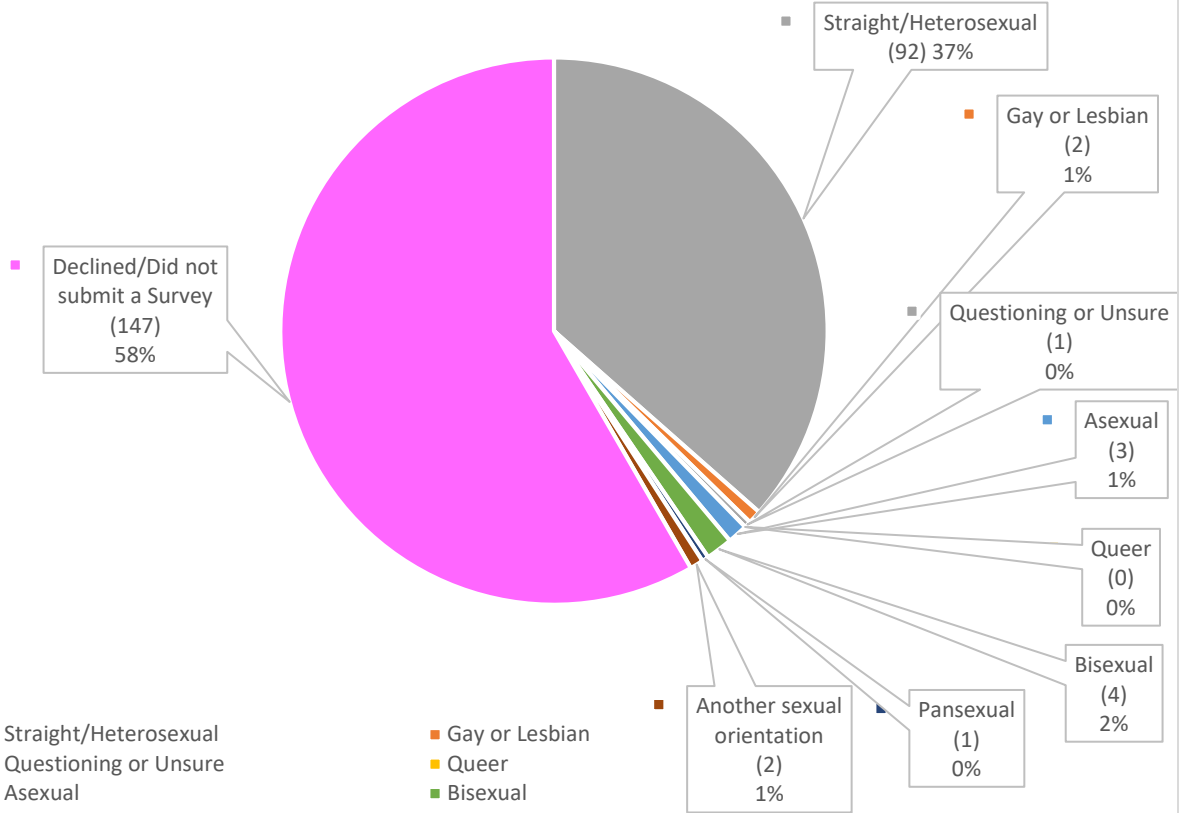

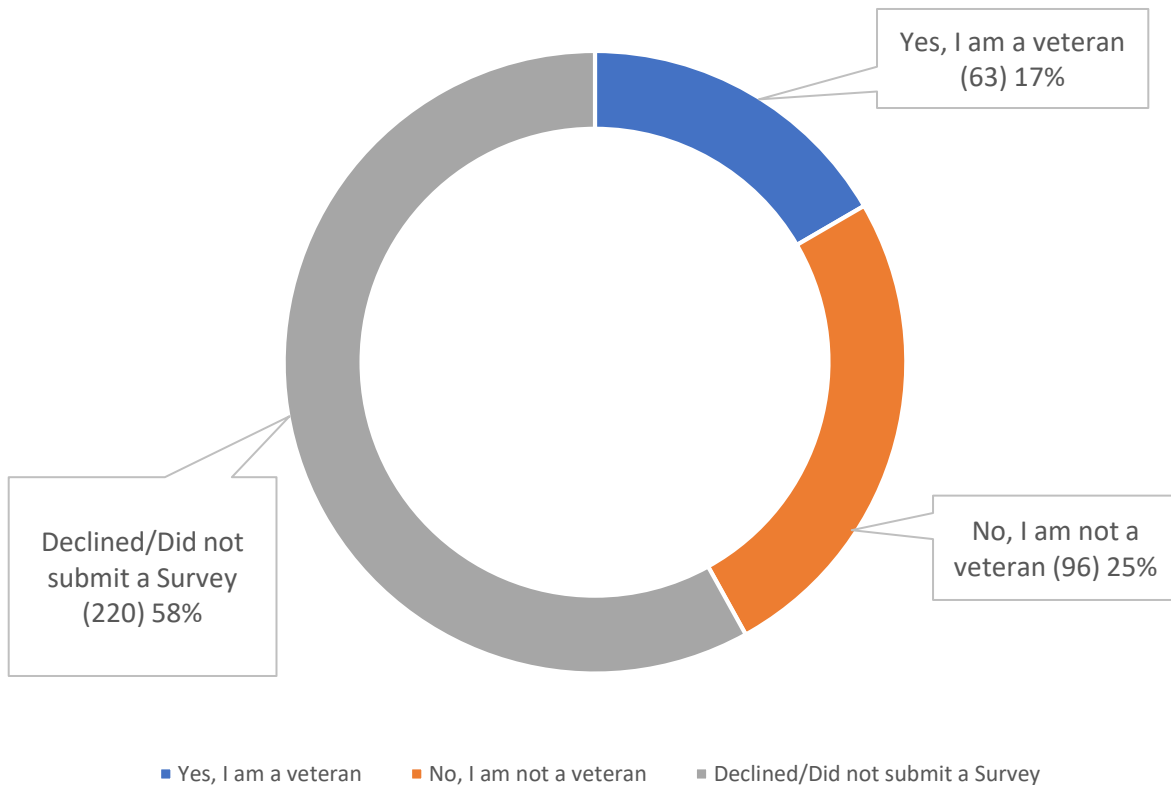

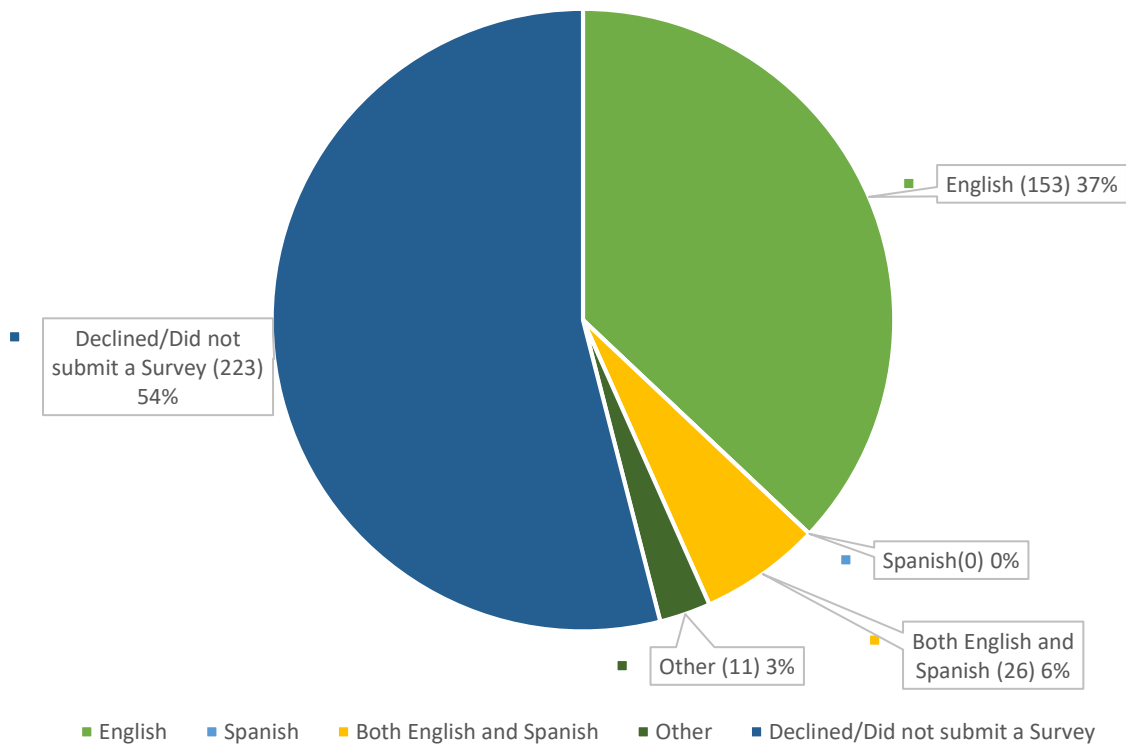
### Q4 - SEXUAL ORIENTATION



### Q4 - VETERAN STATUS

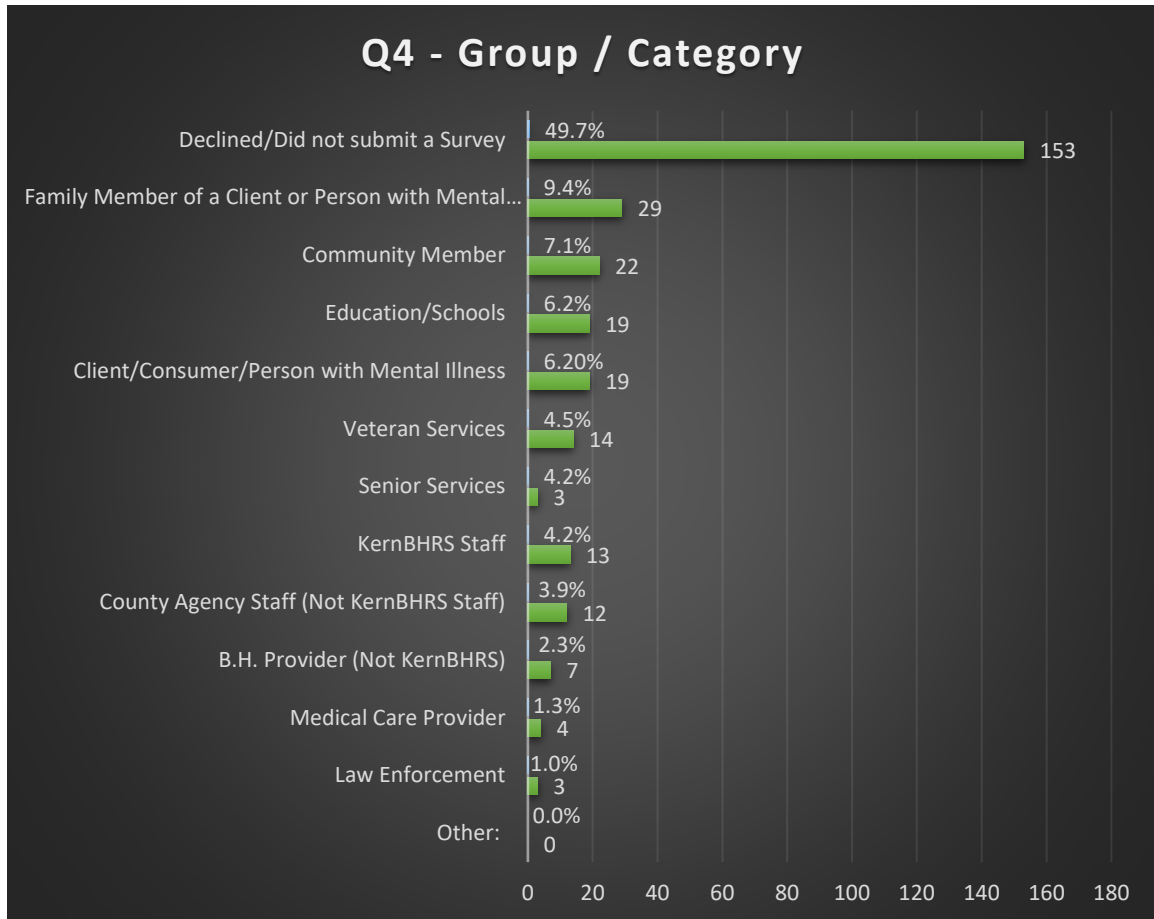


### Q4 - Primary Language






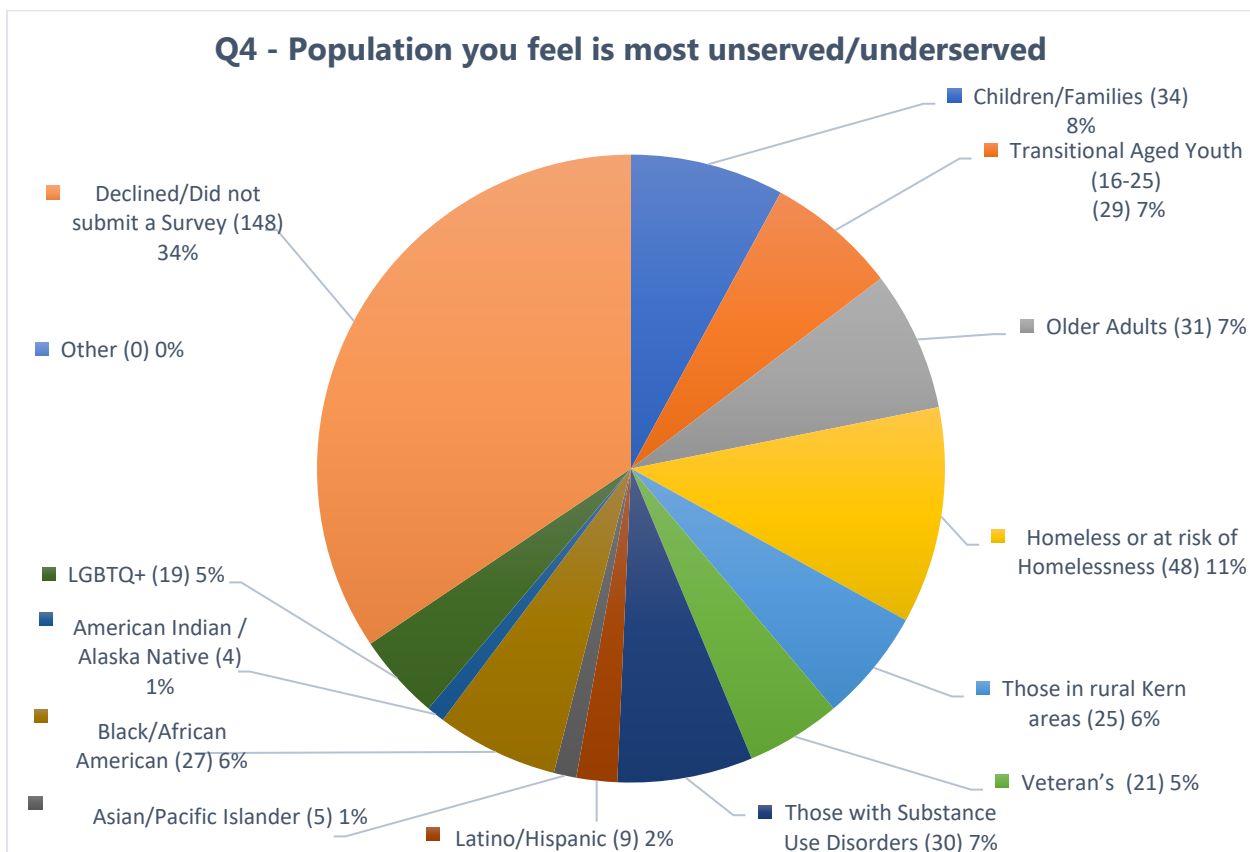
